Sarah Stubblefield called the meeting to order at 3:39 p.m. to conduct the following items of business:

Announcements:

- Ms. Stubblefield introduced the topic for the meeting and the US Census Bureau staff in attendance
- An overview of the Census Complete Count Committee work plan was provided, with a reminder of key dates, including that staff will provide an update to City Council at the June 25 meeting.
- Ms. Stubblefield also provided an update on US Census Bureau activities, the role of the partnership specialists, and the marketing and educational materials currently available from the Bureau.

Presentations and Discussion

Two communities were highlighted in the meeting: the student, renter, and other transient communities and the low-income and living in poverty community. Tony Herhold presented the demographic profile analysis for both communities to the Complete Count Committee. The demographic profile analysis of target communities serves to provide the Arlington context to that target community. This context then informs the Committee on how to build awareness and buy-in within this target community to encourage participation in the 2020 Census.

Upon presentation of this profile, the following issues were discussed:

- How different agencies define the poverty level and how it is defined for individuals versus families.
- How individuals who are transient will be counted, and Jennifer Pope clarified that individuals with a permanent address will receive information about the Census in the mail, while individuals experiencing homelessness will be counted by a special team.

Ms. Stubblefield gave a presentation on the Outreach Activities identified by the Committee to date, with information about the distribution of activities by Hard to Count community, age group, type of activity, and time of occurrence. Staff is working to organize all the activities and will bring them in detail to the Committee for review, discussion, prioritization, and decision-making regarding which activities will be pursued.

Ms. Stubblefield also provided information about an online mapping tool developed by the City University of New York, which presents Census response rates by census tract. The tool provides information about internet access and cell phone ownership, which is relevant due to the ability to complete the Census forms online. The Committee discussed a variety of issues with counting certain communities and ideas for increasing response rates. The Committee will be working closely with US Census Bureau staff and other organizations within Arlington to target outreach and education about the Census.

The Complete Count Committee then spent time filling out activity planning sheets for the student, renter, and other transient communities and the low-income and living in poverty community and shared them with staff. The activity planning sheets will help to identify realistic outreach activities, maximize the impact of outreach efforts, and develop a comprehensive outreach plan that targets all hard-to-count communities. Ms. Stubblefield also asked Committee members to contact her with any requests for additional community information and organization information, in preparation for the next Committee meeting. The next Complete Count Committee meeting will be held June 27th at 3:30pm and will include more information about US Census Bureau and other organization outreach activities.

There being no further business to come before the Committee, the meeting was adjourned at 4:51 P.M.




Marketing Strategy
