#### **Announcements**

- Ms. Stubblefield provided an update on Census response timelines and changes in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. One key change is that the Census response period has been extended to October 31, 2020.
- Ms. Cynthia Cruz provided an update on Census Bureau activities, including virtual community outreach and meetings with local elected officials regarding increasing response rates in their districts.

#### **Presentations and Discussion**

Ms. Stubblefield provided a media and marketing update to the Committee, detailing efforts taken by the City to continue raising awareness of the Census and motivating residents to respond. The Census videos produced and hosted online by the City have received high numbers of views and continue to be shared via social media. More Census content will be generated over the summer and released August through October during the last months of the response period.

A detailed account of Arlington's response rates to date was provided by Ms. Stubblefield. At the time of the meeting, Arlington's overall response rate was at 53.1% and had shown a steady increase during the response rate to date. Arlington's response rate was above that of the national average and the Texas average. City staff are conducting careful monitoring of response rates and will continue to share this information with Committee members weekly. The weekly update is in the form of an infographic with clear and detailed information, allowing outreach to be tailored to areas with lower response rates.

Ms. Stubblefield shared with the Committee news that the City of Arlington was awarded a National League of Cities grant designed to boost Census response rates. These funds will be used to host pop up events with kiosks where residents can complete their Census questionnaire online. The events will be held in high-traffic, low response rate areas in an effort to fulfill a complete count in Arlington.

The meeting concluded with a discussion of ongoing activities, including daily ads and interviews on Dallas Vietnamese Radio, digital targeted ads, social media posts, and flyer distribution through the Arlington library curbside pick-up program. Committee members were encouraged to continuing using their networks to promote Census response, share ideas for outreach, and volunteer to assist with kiosks in the future.

As this was the last official meeting of the Committee, members were thanked for their time and commitment to the Census Complete Count in Arlington. Staff will continue to provide updates to the Committee regarding response rates and future activities during the extended Census response period.

There being no further business to come before the Committee, the meeting was adjourned at 4:47 P.M.













### SELF-RESPONSE RATES IN ARLINGTON CENSUS BUREAU SELF-RESPONSE MAP










Response rate scale by Census tracts

5 highest response tracts


5 lowest response tracts



#### WEEKLY RESPONSE RATE TRACKING




Arlington continues to outpace national and state response rates since data was last reported on April 13. As expected, the daily response rate continues to slow, consistent with national response trends. Despite this decrease, the City of Arlington remains on track to have a higher self-response rate in 2020 than in the 2010 Census. Residents are now able to respond to the Census through October 31, 2020.




