








LANE MILES BY OCI CATEGORY 2015-2023




CURRENT CHALLENGES



- Street rebuild costs have doubled since 2015 and will continue on an upward trend based on the current economy.
- Rising construction costs reduce the number of lane miles maintained each year, accelerating percent of streets falling below 50 OCI.
- Identifying alternative sources of funding to supplement street projects.

10 YEAR OCI FORECAST CURRENT STRATEGY





Street Budget	Predicted OCI in 10 Years
\$18M	46
\$30M	49
\$40M	52

By keeping current pavement strategy and increasing bond funds to provide \$40m in street funding per year, the predicted OCI will lower to 52 in 10 years.

PROPOSED MAINTENANCE STRATEGY



- Transition program to increase maintenance funding and techniques to achieve OCI in the 50-65 range extend the time before a street needs to be rebuilt.
- Utilize bond funds for street rebuild and reclamation programs.


Predicted OCI in 10 Years

10 YEAR FORECAST NEW STRATEGY


10 Year One Budget OCI Predictions Add Mill & Overlay + Increasing Bond Funds



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CURRENT MAINTENANCE STRATEGY

- The previous maintenance strategy was focused on red streets, "worst-first".
- The current maintenance strategy focuses on red and yellow streets using the following techniques:
 - Reclamation full pavement structure maintenance (red & yellow streets)
 - Panel Replacement concrete panel maintenance (red & yellow streets)
 - Mill & Overlay pavement surface maintenance (yellow streets)





MILL & OVERLAY PROGRAM UPDATE



- The Annual Mill & Overlay Program maintenance addresses "yellow" streets throughout the City prior to roadway degrading to a "red" condition.
- The Mill & Overlay Program includes asphalt resurfacing and repairs to driveway, curb & gutter, sidewalk, and ADA ramps.
- In FY23, 26 of 32 lane miles were completed in the Annual Mill & Overlay Program. Streets included had an average OCI of 52. \$10.8M in Street Maintenance Funds was allocated for this project.
- In FY24, the Annual Mill & Overlay Program will resurface approximately 11 lane miles with an average OCI of 51. This project is currently in progress and will use \$3.4M in Street Maintenance Funds.




STREET BOND PROJECTS UNDER CONSTRUCTION

HARRIS ROAD (CALENDER ROAD TO COOPER STREET)



- Rebuild from a 2-lane county-type road to a 4-lane minor collector
- Storm Drainage, Water, and Sewer Improvements
- Streetlights, Pavement Markings, and Street Signs
- Traffic Signal at 1 Intersection
- Sidewalks
- Construction Start: March 2021
- Estimated Completion Date: November 2023



BOWMAN SPRINGS ROAD (I-20 TO ENCHANTED BAY)

- Rebuild to a 3-lane roadway
- Storm Drainage Improvements
- Streetlights, Pavement Markings, Street Signs, and Communications Conduit
- Hike and Bike Trail and Sidewalks
- Roundabout (at Bowman Springs / Greenspring / future Pleasant Ridge intersection) with landscaping and irrigation
- Roundabout was complete in May 2023
- Roadway pavement is complete and open to traffic
- Construction Start: June 2022
- Estimated Completion Date: December 2023





SUBLETT ROAD (WEST CITY LIMITS TO JOPLIN ROAD)




- Construct a 3-lane concrete roadway with curb and gutter
- Installation of bridge over Kee Branch
- Storm Drainage, Water, and Sewer Improvements
- Sidewalks
- On Street Bike Lanes
- Streetlights
- Construction Start: March 2023
- Estimated Completion Date: March 2024




TURNER WARNELL ROAD (COOPER STREET TO MATLOCK ROAD)

- Widen to a 4-lane major arterial divided concrete roadway with curb and gutter
- Storm Drainage, Water and Sewer Improvements
- Pavement Markings, Streetlights, and Communications Conduit
- Sidewalks
- Traffic Signals at 2 Intersections
- Construction Start: April 2023
- Estimated Completion Date: June 2025



POLY WEBB ROAD (PLEASANT RIDGE TO SHOREWOOD)

- Widen from a 2-lane county-type road to a 2lane minor collector
- Roundabout with landscaping and irrigation
- Storm Drainage Improvements
- Streetlights, Pavement Markings, and Street Signs
- Sidewalks
- Construction Start: May 2023
- Estimated Completion Date: November 2024



DEBBIE LANE (CITY LIMITS TO SH 360)




- Widen from a 2-lane county-type road to a 4lane major arterial
- Storm Drainage, Water, and Sewer Improvements
- Streetlights, Pavement Markings, Street Signs, and Communications Conduit
- Traffic Signals at 5 Intersections
- Sidewalks
- Construction Start: December 2023
- Estimated Completion Date: October 2025



2021 RESIDENTIAL REBUILDS (HERSCHEL STREET)



- Rebuild Herschel Street from Martin Luther Drive to New York Avenue to a 2-lane concrete roadway with curb and gutter
- Storm Drainage and Water Improvements
- Sidewalks
- Streetlights
- Construction Start: January 2023
- Completion Date: August 2023
- *Project was completed earlier than contractual time*



2021 RESIDENTIAL REBUILDS (SHENANDOAH DRIVE)



- Rebuild Shenandoah Drive from Timberview Lane to Concord Drive to a 2-lane concrete roadway with curb and gutter
- Storm Drainage, Water, and Sewer Improvements
- Sidewalks
- Streetlights
- Construction Start: August 2023
- Estimated Completion Date: April 2024

RANDOL MILL ROAD (COOPER STREET TO COLLINS STREET)




- Widen to 6-lane road and reconstruct existing 4lanes with curb and gutter
- Storm Drainage, Water and Sewer improvements

- Landscaping
- Project length = 1.0 mile

- Estimated completion date: April 2028



PARK ROW DRIVE (NEW YORK AVENUE TO SH 360)



- Estimated Completion Date: December 2028




SHERRY STREET (PARK ROW DRIVE TO PIONEER PARKWAY)

- Reconstruct Sherry Street to 2-lane undivided concrete roadway
- Storm Drainage, Water, and Sewer Improvements
- Sidewalks and Landscaping
- Streetlights, Signage, Traffic Signals, and Communications Conduit
- Project length = 0.6 miles
- Estimated Construction Start: June 2028
- Estimated Completion Date: December 2029



MANSFIELD WEBB ROAD (S. COLLINS STREET TO NEW YORK AVE)

- Widen to 4-lanes undivided roadway with curb and gutter
- Storm Drainage, Water, and Sewer Improvements
- Sidewalks and Landscaping
- Streetlights, Traffic Signals, Signage, and Communications Conduit
- Project length = 0.8 miles
- Estimated Construction Start: June 2028
- Estimated Completion date: December 2029




