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Regional Mobility Update

This quarterly newsletter attempts to present in one place the plans and projects underway by the City of Arlington that impact the FY2013 City Council priority of Enhancing Regional Mobility. Each issue will feature information on both long-term issues and short-term projects.



ARLINGTON'S INTELLIGENT TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM

Arlington's Intelligent Transportation System is a network of components that work together 24/7 to keep traffic flowing optimally throughout the 99.5 square miles of the city every day.

Traffic Coordination

338 of the city's 343 (99%) signalized intersections are connected by 200 miles of fiber optic cable to the Traffic Management Center (TMC) in the Ott Cribbs Police Station. Traffic Engineers and Signal Technicians determine how best to utilize the signals in real time.

- Groups of intersections are programmed with coordinated timing tailored to the time of day; for example, signals along Cooper are timed differently for morning rush hour, evening rush hour, and other times of day. Detailed plans specify the pattern each signal in the group should run.
- Other single intersections are programmed individually.
- Some intersections generally function by detecting vehicles, holding green on main streets until a car approaches on the side street.

System Maintenance

The fiber connection to the TMC enables the Signal Technician who monitors the system to be able to check for malfunctions remotely. Citizens sometimes call about long waits at signals when actually the signal is in the midst of resetting to normal operation after an emergency vehicle has preempted it. The TMC Signal Technician can check this and save the Field Technicians the time that would have been spent driving to the signal. Because of the connection, the TMC Signal Technician is also instantly notified if a signal stops working, for example, when a contractor hits conduit or weather conditions affect signal operation. An LED map of the City connected to the software system at the TMC shows the current condition of all the signals, in color code.

Special Events

Traffic Monitoring Cameras also provide information for 120 locations throughout Arlington, streaming video to LCD monitors at the TMC capable of showing 32 locations simultaneously. These are especially useful during special events, not only to check for traffic gathering at a light but also to check barricade set ups compared to engineered specifications before the event. Tax-Free Weekend, Christmas shopping season, and the stadiums all have groups of signals preprogrammed and additional staff at the TMC monitoring their operation by camera and computer. "The goal is to help people get in and out as quickly and safely as possible," says City Traffic Engineer Paul Iwuchukwu. "We can detect traffic congestion and mitigate as soon as it occurs. We can adjust signal timing to keep traffic moving." During events, Traffic Engineering staff members each monitor a group of intersections and make changes as needed.



Additions to the Network

City of Arlington ITS improvements currently underway include the addition of four more stationary Dynamic Message Signs. These signs are exactly like the four currently operated by Public Works and Transportation, located along Division and Collins Streets. The four new sign locations are: Randol Mill Road just east of Mesquite, Stadium Drive just north of Division, Ballpark Way just north of Convention Center, and Legends Way just south of Copeland Road. These signs will be interconnected to the City of Arlington TMC and will provide real time valuable information to the public. They were funded by federal grants through TxDOT.

Regional Improvements

Regional ITS improvements are also in process, to link information among the TMCs for City of Arlington, TxDOT in Fort Worth and Dallas, and City of Grand Prairie. In the near future it will be possible for these entities to view real-time video feeds from each other's cameras by selecting the camera on a map. The enhancements will also make it possible for TxDOT to control Arlington traffic signal timing in the case of an emergency situation. Traffic incident data, such as construction lane closures and traffic accidents will also be updated, shared, and instantly displayed on a regional map. Funding was provided by NCTCOG and TxDOT. The plan is for all metroplex cities to be linked, to allow all the agencies to be more proactive in adjusting for changes in the roadway network as they occur.
