


SCAM ALERT: SCAMMERS POSING AS ARLINGTON PD CALLING RESIDENTS SEEKING MONEY

As technology becomes more advanced, so do the scammers who exploit it to steal from unsuspecting victims. We want to alert the public about one such scam that is currently targeting Arlington residents.

Multiple people have recently reported receiving a phone call from someone claiming to be an APD Sergeant. This scammer tells them they have a missed court date and a warrant has now been issued for their arrest. The



warrant and avoid going to jail.

Victims have told investigators they thought the call was legitimate because when they checked their caller ID, the number displayed was (817) 459-5700 – which is the main number for the Arlington Police Department.

Call masking technology allows someone to create an alternate number to route their outgoing calls through, so they can keep their actual contact information private. Unfortunately, scammers have learned they can use this technology to their advantage – in this instance, making it appear that their calls are coming directly from APD.

We want to remind residents that we will NEVER call you seeking money, nor would we instruct you to pay fines via money transfer service, cryptocurrency, or gift card. If you ever receive a call like this or have any concerns about outstanding warrants, we encourage you to contact us directly and verify.

Investigators are working to determine who is making these calls.
